Общая информация

Экзамен состоит из устной и письменной части. Письменная часть включает в себя Listening, Reading, Grammar и Writing. Экзамен по устной части включает в себя :

1) чтение текста вслух без предварительной подготовки,

2) участие в социологическом опросе на английском языке

3) монологическое рассуждение по конкретной теме.

<u>Первая часть</u> – чтение текста вслух. Учащемуся даётся 1,5 минуты на подготовку к чтению. Необходимо бегло просмотреть текст, понять, о чем он, и постараться выделить слова, которые могут вызывать затруднения при прочтении. Чтобы получить балл за чтение, необходимо допустить не более 5 фонетических ошибок. При этом учитываются те ошибки, которые препятствуют пониманию смысла. Если учащийся неправильно прочёл слово, а потом сам исправился, учитывается правильный вариант.

<u>Вторая часть</u> представляет собой участие в социологическом опросе. Учащемуся необходимо ответить на вопросы по определенной теме. На каждый ответ даётся 40 секунд.

В <u>третьей части</u> экзамена учащемуся нужно представить монолог по заданной теме (Sport, Culture, Ecology). На подготовку даётся 1,5 минуты. За это время ученик должен успеть ознакомиться с планом ответа и продумать речь. Ответ должен быть кратким, но информативным, потому что на монологическое высказывание отводится 2 минуты.

This suggests that the arrangement of stones may work as a calendar. In Egypt and South America, similar ancient buildings can be found. They also show the time of the solstice. Stonehenge itself is owned by the Crown and managed by English Heritage.

A rainbow is an arc of colour in the sky that can be seen when the sun shines through falling rain. The rainbow has no definite number of physical colours but seven are traditionally listed. The pattern of colours starts with red on the outside and changes through orange, yellow, green, blue, to violet on the inside. Sometimes a second, larger, dimmer rainbow is seen. A rainbow is created when white light is refracted while entering a droplet of water, split into separate colours, and reflected back. A rainbow is actually round like a circle. On the ground, the bottom part is hidden, but in the sky, like from a flying aeroplane, it can be seen as a circle around the point opposite the Sun. Rainbows often appear after storms, and are popular symbols for peace in many cultures.
